• Basic English

This course helps prepare students for college writing by focusing on developing a sound writing process and introducing them to rhetorical principles and best practices. Students engage in creative and multimodal writing to develop writing process that work for them.

• English Composition I

This writing-intensive first-year writing course focuses on developing rhetorical skills and writing processes that will help students succeed as writers in the university setting. Students write four papers and a final in a variety of genres. • English Composition II

This course, also writing-intensive, builds on the material covered in English Composition I, adding an MLA research component. The students work in stages to craft a full research paper, with milestones in that process serving as major assignments throughout the semester.

• Business and Professional Writing

Another writing-intensive class, professional writing focuses on familiarizing students with various genres of workplace writing (e.g., e-mails, memos, letters, research reports, recommendation proposals, etc.) as well as the demands of an increasingly technology-oriented business environment. I redesigned this course and drafted learning outcomes after the course was not taught within the English and Philosophy Department for several semesters.

• Technical Writing

This writing-intensive class is designed to teach rhetorical strategies to help majors in various fields communicate more effectively in their disciplines and in the workplace. Students will develop their knowledge of common genres and approaches for effective visual and verbal presentation of information. They will learn how to identify audiences and determine purposes for writing as they can make informed choices about media, genre, content, organization, style, and visual design.
