



Program Completer/Alumni Survey Fall 2024

Survey Description: The anonymous survey is comprised of four sections: (a) information on the respondent (i.e., graduation year, program, degree, etc.) for analysis purposes; (b) assessment of the program's ability to prepare respondent for skills in the workforce (InTASC aligned and CAEP Advanced aligned); (c) overall program effectiveness ratings. Please note the yellow highlighted section that allows respondents to self-assess the impact they have had on student learning. The survey items use a 5-point Likert scale rating system, with higher mean ratings being more favorable.

Distribution: The AUM Program Completer/Alumni Survey is distributed annually to all program completers from the past three academic years, both CAEP and non-CAEP programs. This iteration of the survey, sent to program completers/alumni who graduated in AY's 2021-22, 2022-23, and 2023-24 was disseminated via email from November 21 through December 13, 2024. Program completers were contacted using multiple email distribution lists, both former AUM and Auburn college email and personal email addresses, gathered from the AUM Alumni Office and pulled from the AUM database.

Response Rate: The AUM College of Education program graduated 577 students in all college programs, both CAEP and non-CAEP accredited in academic years 2021-22, 2022-23, and 2023-24. A total of 28 emails were undeliverable. Thirty-one (N=31) program completers out of 549 who were successfully contacted responded to the survey, yielding a 6% response rate. Ideally, the response rate should be close to 20% to make meaningful interpretations of the data; however, some patterns at the college-level emerged that are worth noting.

Results: Three tables, organized by department, are provided within the report; CAEP programs only are presented. Program and degree data is provided per department. Advanced data (M.Ed. and Ed.S.) are shaded gray. Due to small sample sizes of well less than five per program or degree, it is recommended that data not be over generalized. All data across the department and across the college are merged in the final two columns as labeled.

As noted, the small sample sizes (often only one respondent, if any, per program or degree) make meaningful analysis difficult. Patterns cannot be observed with only one respondent in a data cell. The one observable trend is as follows: At the college level—and consistently within programs—the four final items that evaluate overall program worth yielded the highest overall mean ratings.

Program and/or departmental data can be collapsed or analyzed in other ways if requested, such as by degree across a department or college. Data displayed in charts instead of tables can be provided upon request as well.
