MPS CORE: Three courses (9 hours)		Course Descriptions
POLS 6060 Research Design		Develops skills and knowledge for conducting and evaluating policy-relevant research. Various research designs and data collection techniques are discussed.
POLS 6080 Statistics and Data Analysis		Introduces students to fundamental concepts in statistical description and inference.
INFO 5880 Data Analysis for Competitive Advantage		Introduces data analysis and its applications. Case approach is used to emphasize hands-on learning and a real-world view of big data analytics.
POLS 6090 Research Seminar		Students conduct independent research on a topic of interest and relevance approved and overseen by the instructor.
MPS ELECTIVES: (Any Seven Courses: 21 hours)		Course Descriptions
POLS 6010 Foundations of Public Administration		Examines the constitutional, institutional, political and social environment in which public administration occurs and introduces students to the important theories, concepts, functions and issues in public administration.
POLS 6130 State and Local Government		Examines the functions, processes, and challenges of state and local governments in the United States.
POLS 6200 U.S. Foreign Policy		An examination of American diplomatic experience and foreign relations from the Revolution to the present.
POLS 6280 International Political Economy		Explores the relationship between states and markets in the international economy and surveys leading explanations for the evolution and content of the international economic system.
POLS 6450 Comparative Government and Politics		An examination of the institutions, political processes, functions and problems of major contemporary political systems from a comparative perspective.
POLS 6510 Congressional Politics		Focuses on the role and functions of the Congress and presidency in the U.S. political system.
POLS 6660 Democracy and Democratization		Explores the roots, development, and major components of the democratic idea, the variety of the modern democratic practice, as well as the spread of democracy in the modern world and its effects on international politics.
POLS 6972 Special Topics: International Security		Examines major threats to global security, the causes of war, insurgencies, terrorism, arms races, instability, and humanitarian crises.
